Operation Turning Point

Operation Turning Point (OTP) provides 33 units of leased scattered site housing in Milwaukee County. CVI leases units with various property managers in Milwaukee County. Units are furnished and basic supplies are provided. Clients who are eligible for this program, will pay 30% of their income as rent. Supportive services in the form of case management are offered to all clients and are available 5 days a week to assist clients with achieving their goals. OTP offers 3 two bedroom units and 2 three bedroom units with the remainder being one bedroom units.

Veterans Gardens

Veterans Gardens is 30 units of housing owned and operated by CVI at four separate locations. This program offers one, two, and three bedroom units to homeless and disabled Veterans. Two ADA units are available for clients with the need for accommodation. Units are furnished and basic supplies are provided. Clients who are eligible for this program, will pay 30% of their income as rent. Support is provided by case management 5 days a week to assist clients with achieving their goals.

College Avenue Apartments

College Avenue Apartments, located in Racine, WI, has 18 single occupancy units of Permanent Supportive Housing owned and operated by CVI. Two ADA units are available for clients with the need for accommodation. Support is provided by one case manager available 5 days a week to assist clients with achieving their goals. Clients who are eligible for this program, will pay 30% of their income as rent.

Other Housing

CVI also has two permanent housing facilities in Milwaukee and Green Bay. The Thomas H. Wynn Sr. Veterans Manor is a 52 unit facility located in Milwaukee, WI. Major General Jacob Brown Veterans Manor, located in Green Bay, WI, is a 50 unit facility.

Our Focus

CVI's Permanent Supportive Housing Programs provides supportive housing to literally homeless and disabled U.S. Veterans and their families.

Our programs use a client centered strength based approach that focuses on participants strengths and assists the individual in establishing their own long and short term goals. We utilize a Housing First philosophy that does not require individuals to participate in other services before they can obtain safe, and sanitary affordable housing.

We believe that a place to call home is essential for individuals to begin their healing, and learn how to deal with other barriers in order to become self-sufficient.

Who We Serve?

To be eligible for CVI's Permanent Supportive Housing Programs, the following must apply;

1. You must be a **Veteran**
2. You must be **literally homeless** and currently living in one of the following situations:
 - Places not meant for human habitation, such as a car, park, or streets.
 - Emergency shelter
 - Transitional shelter that originally came from #1 or #2 above.
3. You must have a **disability** that is certifiable by an appropriate state licensed physician.

Program staff will be assigned to walk each client through this process and work to obtain the necessary documentation. If you are not sure if you qualify or need assistance, please visit us and we will work with you.

How Do I Apply For Services?

Call 2-1-1

Tell them you are a Veteran, and ask to be placed on the coordinated entry list for PSH.

You must be literally homeless or request to be placed on the CE List by your current case manager.
